Kidz Lit encourages students to develop a love for reading through its standards aligned curriculum. Students in each grade will read a number of books as a group throughout the year. Their reading will be supplemented with interactive discussions and activities that include writing, oral presentation, debate, and art. (*This class is taught by each mentor in each grade level*)

Visionaries is a media class where scholars will learn how to create short films, documentaries, PSAs, and commercials about everything and anything that concerns them and their community. All projects created throughout the year will be showcased to the community at special events. (*Mentors: Gabriel Lomeli & Ivan Martinez*)

News Team and Hoover Yearbook is designed for students who want to inform their peers about the latest news and trends at Hoover School and in their local community. They will be taking footage of various school and clubhouse events, documenting news and interviewing important people as they go. In the process, a monthly newsletter and yearbook will be created to showcase their projects. (*Mentors: Amis Maldonado & Liz Calderon*)

Jr. Engineers is meant to inspire the future engineers of our society. Through various hands-on projects, scholars will explore how things like bridges, rockets, and skyscrapers are made and built to last. Starting in mid-October, students will also have the opportunity to participate once a week in a very interactive science program called **Super Star Science**, run by student volunteers from Stanford University. Power Point Power teaches students how to organize and create presentations using Power Point. Scholars will explore various topics that interest them and learn how to amaze any audience with their visually artistic presentations. (*Mentor: Noe Salinas*)
